Fluent in French and English, with basic knowledge in Spanish and Japanese, Patrick Gilabert holds a Ph. D in technology management (University Aix- Marseille III), a Master in socio-economics (University Aix-Marseille I), complemented by the Trium executive MBA (HEC Paris, London School of Economics, New York University Stern School of Business).

Awarded with Madagascar “Chevalier de l’Ordre National” and two medals by Vietnam Government for his contributions to national progress in agriculture and industry, he has co- authored several publications, including most recently “Un défi pour la planète: Les Objectifs de développement durable en débat” (IRD Editions, 2017).
